PHOTOGRAPH DECLARATION FORM FOR NEW PERSONAL LICENCE APPLICATIONS

Note to Applicant

When submitting an application for a Personal Licence, you are required to submit two passport-sized photographs of yourself, one endorsed and signed by a counter-signatory. This is someone who is known to you but not a spouse or relative, lives in the UK and holds a current British or Irish passport. The point of a counter-signatory is to prove your identity and can include:

- Solicitor, Commissioner of Oaths, Justice of the Peace, Barrister
- Bank or Building Society Official, Police Officer, Civil Servant, Minister of Religion, Local Government Officer
- Individual with a professional qualification.

In order that we can verify the person endorsing your photograph, please ask that person to also complete this form.

Note to counter-signatory
