**NOTICE OF DETERMINATION IN RESPECT OF A HEARING**  
**WHICH TOOK PLACE ON THURSDAY 20 NOVEMBER 2014**  
**TO DETERMINE AN APPLICATION BY SEAFOOD PUB COMPANY HOLDINGS LIMITED**  
**FOR A PREMISES LICENCE IN RESPECT OF**  
**THE ASSHETON ARMS, DOWNHAM, CLITHEROE, BB7 4BJ.**

The Sub-Committee met to consider the application of the Seafood Pub Company Limited for a premises licence.

The Sub-Committee considered the contents of the report of the Head of Legal and Democratic Services dated 20 November 2014 and its appendices ("**Report**") and the subsequent correspondence, which had passed between Mr Ireland and Mr & Mrs I Chadwick and Mrs D Braithwaite by email and by post.

Mr Ireland made verbal representations to the Sub-Committee. He explained the background to the application; the details of the representations, which had been received, and that mediation had taken place although it had not been possible to reach agreement.

He also explained the concessions, which his client had made which were set out in paragraph 2.8 of the Report. He also explained that his client had voluntarily put forward conditions within section M of its application.

Mr Ireland then went through the representations raised and put forward his clients position on each.

The Licensing Sub-Committee gave careful consideration to the representations made by all parties, both verbal and written. The Sub-Committee also considered the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003, the licensing objectives, the relevant regulations and the Council's licensing policy.

Having considered all of the above the Sub-Committee resolved to grant the application as applied for (including the conditions set out in section M) incorporating the concessions set out in paragraph 2.8 of the Report and to include an additional condition that:

*"Refuse, i.e. bottle sorting/disposal shall not take place outside the premises between 9pm and 8am".*
