Working smoke alarms are very important, test them weekly.

- Plan an escape route
- If there is smoke on your exit route, get down low and crawl out
- Get out, Stay out and call 999

GUARDIAN ANGELS WRISTBANDS

Guardian Angles help to support families and carers with loved ones living with alzheimers and dementia. The devices help protect them when out alone and let them live their lives more independently.

999ReUnite is a collaboration between the police, fire and ambulance service and involves each service issuing the most vulnerable with a wristband.

The wristband uses near field communication (NFC) technology and, if scanned with a mobile device, it will display a name and mobile number for emergency contacts.
